As a victim of a crime, you have certain rights. This form will assist you in explaining your rights as a victim and who to contact for additional assistance. Information given to you as a victim should be treated as confidential and be used to assist you in dealing with your personal safety or reimbursement for damages or injury suffered as the result of the offender's act. Any information concerning a juvenile that is given to you as a Victim must be treated as confidential and is not to be disclosed to others.

*Please remember that in some cases an arrest is not made in connection with a crime.*

## UNKNOWN SUSPECTS

- An arrest may not be made during the initial investigation of the crime reported. The law enforcement agency will continue to investigate your case as information develops. You may contact the investigating law enforcement agency at any time to report additional information, ask questions, or determine the status of your investigation.

## ADULT SUSPECTS

- If an Adult Suspect has immediately been arrested and **confined to Jail** in connection with this investigation, you may contact the Wood County Sheriff's Department to determine if the suspect has been released from Jail. Suspects will be held in Jail in accordance with Wisconsin State Statutes and Bail Provisions. The case will be referred to the Wood County District Attorney's Office for prosecution.

- If an Adult Suspect has been identified but not confined in Jail in connection with this case and there is Probable Cause for an arrest, the case will be referred to the Wood County District Attorney's Office for prosecution. The Wood County District Attorney's Office will review the case and decide whether criminal charges will be filed in the case and whether or not any court proceedings will continue. As the case progresses through the Court System, you will be contacted by the Wood County District Attorney's Office: Victim Witness Services to keep you apprised of the case. ## JUVENILE SUSPECTS

- If a Juvenile Suspect has been taken into custody and **detained in a secure setting** in connection with this investigation, you may contact Wood County Social Services Office (Intake Worker) for information. The Intake Worker or Judge will follow Wisconsin State Statutes when determining where and for how long a juvenile will be detained. The case will be referred to Juvenile Intake for review.

- If a Juvenile Suspect has been identified, but not detained, the case will be referred to Wood County Social Services Juvenile Intake for review.

A juvenile intake worker will contact you to advise of the status of the case.

### **VICTIMS HAVE RIGHTS!**

As a victim of a crime, you have certain rights under Wisconsin Law. Some important rights you have include the following:

- ◆ The right to attend court proceedings.
- ◆ The right to be notified of hearings and court proceedings.
- ◆ The right to be notified of hearings and court proceedings in the disposition of your case.
- ◆ The right to receive compensation for certain losses.
- ◆ The right to restitution or judgement for unpaid restitution.
- ◆ The right to have recovered property returned in a timely manner.
- ◆ The right to have certain information from law enforcement agencies and district attorneys.
- ◆ The right to have input into certain case proceedings.
