Parks & Recreation Commission Minutes

January 9, 2023

The Parks & Recreation Commission met on Monday, January 9, 2023, at 4 p.m. in the first floor conference room at City Hall, 444 West Grand Avenue, Wisconsin Rapids, WI. The meeting was also streamed LIVE on the City of Wisconsin Rapids Facebook page.

1. Call to order.

Commissioner Veneman called the meeting to order at 4:02 p.m.

Mayor Blaser, Craig Broeren, Tom Ekelin, Tom Rayome, and Dean Veneman were in attendance. Lee Thao joined the meeting at 4:20 p.m. (after Planning Commission). Kris Barteck, Patrick Gatterman, and Carolynn Martin were absent. Staff present were Dawn Desorcy and Jake Klingforth (via Zoom).

2. <u>Approve November 14, 2022, meeting minutes</u>.

A motion was made by Commissioner Broeren, seconded by Commissioner Rayome, to approve the minutes of November 14, 2022. Motion carried.

3. <u>Consider approval of Prairie Dog Exhibit plans and expenditures.</u>

Public bid is needed for glass since the cost will be over \$25,000. There will still be money remaining in the Teske Grant after this project is completed.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rayome, seconded by Commissioner Veneman, to approve moving forward on plans and expenditures for the Prairie Dog Exhibit, with total costs not to exceed \$60,000. Motion carried.

4. Consider changes/upgrade to Aquatics Center chemicals.

At this point Commissioner Thao joined the meeting.

A motion was made by Commissioner Veneman, seconded by Commissioner Rayome, to approve the changes/upgrades to Aquatics Center chemicals. Motion carried.

5. <u>Update on dog park progress</u>.

Downed trees are being removed. Progress is going faster than anticipated. The parking lot will be graded next. The crew is working on things as they can.

6. Bills.

A motion was made by Commissioner Ekelin, seconded by Commissioner Thao, to approve the bills. Motion carried.

7. Staff reports.

8. Adjourn.





After awards are approved, funded partners will be required to execute a Funding Agreement with the Legacy Foundation of Central Wisconsin before the project activities can officially commence. Only the lead community partner organization will receive funding. The lead community partner is responsible for allocating funds to any other partners.

Funding Partner Eligibility

Eligible community partners are based in the Greater Wisconsin Rapids area, non-profit, IRS tax exempt 501(c)3 or government organizations, including but not limited to:

- Health, social service and other community-based organizations
- Local governments
- Voluntary associations, foundations, civic and citizen groups
- · Federally-recognized Indian tribal governments, tribes and tribal organizations

Reporting

Projects funded by the Legacy Foundation must continually engage in a program of evaluation activities to document achieved outcomes and to disseminate lessons learned. Funded projects will undergo an annual assessment of progress toward achieving their objectives and outcomes which may have an impact on future funding.

Progress reports, site visits and conference calls are required throughout the duration of the project and will be scheduled in collaboration between Legacy Foundation and our project partners. A Final Report is required upon completion of all projects. In addition to progress and financial reporting, partners may be expected to report on continued outcomes, sustainability of the project, and any expansion of the project at regular intervals beyond the duration of the award.
