WRFDmeetings, events, training, and notable calls for the month of March:

- ➤ Hosted monthly emergency first responder training
- > Attended MSTCannual Protective Services update meeting
- Attended Wood County Dispatcher meeting held in Pitts ville
- > Several meetings with Five Bugles Design regarding the fire station design
- Attended two meetings regarding 2021-2023 contract for state hazmat teams
- > Conducted promotional testing process for the lieutenants position
- Reviewed Incident Command System roles and responsibilities with department officers with goal of improving the ICS structural process at emergency incidents
- All three crews completed basic fire ground operation and initial set-up of the fire scene
- All three crews reviewed EMS Field Operational Guideline changes to associated protocols
- > All three crews received feedback on the department's annual Quality Assurance summary
- > One member is still attending fire inspection classes through MSTC to receive certification
- > Continued to provide patient monitoring at the Wood County Health Department vaccination clinics
- Vehicle fire at 15 Black Oak Circle, SUVwas a total loss and heat from the fire melted siding on residence
- ➤ Vehicle fire at 820 2<sup>nd</sup> St North, resulted in substantial damage to the engine compartment
- > Cooking fire at 511 10<sup>th</sup> St North. There was no structural damage, crews ventilated home and assessed resident for smoke inhalation
- > Building fire at 311 Oak Street, a grass fire spread to a wooden fence, which then ignited the garage. Garage sustained moderate damage to siding.
- > Structure fire at 2830 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave. South, the fire was located in a basement wall. The fire was quickly extinguished with no extension and the home was ventilated
- $\triangleright$  Cooking fire at 840 8<sup>th</sup> St South, the fire was contained to the broiler area by a fire suppression system until crews arrived and could completely extinguish

#### WRFDNotes:

With an early spring upon us, we have already responded to several small grass fires and numerous burning complaints in the city. The leadership at the WRFDwill be reviewing Chapter 18 in the city's Municipal Code to streamline and make recommend changes to the current fire codes. Once completed we will work with the city attorney and the appropriate committee to ensure the proper process is followed.
