August 12th we held our first Retiree breakfast at our new Station I. Many of the former members that set the foundation that we currently work from were in attendance. The day started off with a breakfast cooked by our members and sponsored by Local 425 that saw many of our past members getting to know all the new faces of WRFD. What a great networking for both groups. Our younger members were able to hear the way it used to be and for the Retirees to see the advances in the industry from their era. Most of these members were a part of the service when we ran 1,000 – 2,000 calls a year versus 4,600 calls a year. The carcinogen free concept was one of the items they were most impressed about, and made many comments about never knowing their affect in their day. In the ned they were all very appreciative of the day and there are plans to invite them in more often to be a part of what they built.

August 13th, was a historic day for WRFD. We held the Ribbon Cutting for the Station Renovation/Addition. The event was well attended even though the weather did not cooperate. The event began with an Invocation from the Pastor from Woodlands Church, followed by some words from Mayor Blaser, Senator Testin, and Representative Krug. A short review of the project was given by Chief Eckes followed by a Hose uncoupling instead of a ribbon cutting. The hose is a lifeline for Firefighters and the Citizens that we serve. What better symbolic item for the opening of the new Station I. Our most tenured member Battalion Chief Joe Kubis and the youngest members on duty completed the uncoupling that day Firefighter/Medic Cole Varsho. Many Citizens, dignitaries, friends, & family members were then guided through the new Station identifying to them the upgrades and changes. Every member at WRFD Thank the Citizens and decision makers that made this project happen. This will make a tremendous difference in our response, our safety, and our living conditions for many year into the future.

She will spend the next three weeks going through Orientation, and then spend two shifts riding on the ambulance not counting to staff. Once that time is complete, she will be assigned to Crew 2 where she will work through her Firefighter Task book completing her 12-month probationary period. Alexandra comes to us from the Altoona area where she has been a member since 2016 and worked for the MAYOhospital system since 2019 working as a Paramedic in their ambulance system. WRFD welcomes Lexi aboard and know that she will be a great asset to our team and an even better member of our Fire Department Family.
