- ➤ Cas leak at 1500 24th St So, metering led crew to a faulty propane tank on a tow motor
- ➤ Structure fire at 440 Daly Ave. resulting in one fatality. The second floor had extreme fire damage. There was smoke and water damage to the first floor. Bottom tenant was displaced. We received automatic and mutual aid from; Port Edwards, Grand Rapids and Biron Fire Departments and EMS stand-by from Nekoosa Ambulance Service
- Responded to eight motor vehicle accidents resulting in six injuries. One accident required extensive extrication, with patient flown to a local trauma center

WRFDNotes:

After a six-month delay, the WRFD received notice that our EMS re-accreditation site review will be taking place on December 10 and 11th. We are excited and look forward to this this process once again, as it validates the time and commitment we place in providing the best EMS service to the communities that we serve. If we receive re-accreditation, we will be one of two services in the state that maintains this certification.

October was a busy month for the WRFD. In fact, the last three months have been three of the busiest months in department history and after the slowest April in the department's history (due to Covid restrictions), we are
